PATTERN INFORMATION



SKILL LEVEL



Easy

APPROXIMATE SIZE



Diameter and length 6 cms (2.4 in)

TECHNIQUE



Crochet Amigurumi

HOW TO READ THIS PATTERN

This pattern is worked in rounds or turns. The number in parentheses indicates the total number of stitches expected at the end of the round. Use a stitch marker to mark the beginning of each round and count your stitches carefully. If necessary, adjust the stitch count to achieve the proper proportions. You may change colors to suit your preference.



MATERIALS



2 mm cotton yarn in the following colors
Light Green and White



Fiberfill or synthetic stuffing



Safety eyes:
5-6 mm



Black embroidery thread



Keychain hardware
Optional



TOOLS



Crochet hook: Appropriate for your yarn weight .
(2.5 mm)



Yarn needle



Stitch marker



Scissors



Pins





Abbreviations (US terms)

Abbreviation	Meaning
st(s)	Stitch(es)
MR	Magic ring
R	Round, turn, or row
ch	Chain
sc	Single crochet
hdc	Half double crochet
dc	Double crochet
tr	Treble crochet
sl st or sl st	Slip stitch
inc	Increase (2 sc in the same stitch)
dec	Decrease (2 sc together)
BLO	Work in the back loop only
FLO	Work in the front loop only
() xN	Repeat the instructions inside the parentheses N times.





PATTERN



GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- This little whale is crocheted in one piece, including the fins and tail, which greatly simplifies assembly.
- This pattern is worked in closed or joined rounds, but you can work it in a spiral; in that case, do not work the sl st at the end or the ch at the beginning of each round.



Note Remember to place a stitch marker in the 1st st of each round.

BODY AND FINS · R₁–R₁₀

- Start with **light** green

R1 1 MR with 6 sc. Close the ring. 1 sl st (in the 1st st), 1 turning ch (6)

R2 Begin in the same st and work 6 inc, 1 sl st, 1 ch (12)

R3 (1 sc, 1 inc) x6. 1 sl st, 1 ch (18)



R4 (1 sc, 1 inc, 1 sc) x6. 1 sl st, 1 ch (24)

R5 (3 sc, 1 inc) x6. 1 sl st, 1 ch (30)

R6-9 4 Rounds. 30 sc, 1 sl st. (30)

- Without cutting the yarn, crochet the Tail Fin:

R10

- **Lobe 1:** 5 ch. Starting in the 2nd ch, work 4 sc toward the body.
- **Lobe 2:** 5 ch. Starting in the 2nd ch, work 4 sc toward the body.
- Return to the 1st st of the base and work 6 sc in the next stitches of the body.
- Side Fins:
- **Fin 1:** In the next (7th st), work in **FLO** as follows: 1 sl st, 2 ch, and 1 dc in the same stitch. In the next stitch: 1 dc, 2 ch, 1 sl st.
- Now, working through both loops, continue with 14 sc in the next stitches of the body.





- **Fin 2:** In the next two stitches, continue working in **FLO** by repeating the pattern for Fin 1

- Work 6 sc (through both loops) in the remaining stitches of the round.

- In the last stitch, change to the color **White** and cut the **green** yarn



BELLY: · R11–R15

- With **White**

R11 Start with 1 ch, 30 sc, 1 sl st, 1 ch (30).



Note Note: In the 2 stitches where you made each fin, make sure to work into the back loops left unused.
Tie 2 small knots with the remaining yarn tails



R12 (3 sc, 1 dec) x6. 1 sl st, 1 ch (24)

R13 (1 sc, 1 dec, 1 sc) x6. 1 sl st, 1 ch (18)

R14 (1 sc, 1 dec) x6. 1 sl st, 1 ch (12)

- Use pins to determine where to place the **eyes**. Place them between R9 and 10, with 6 sts between them. Secure them. Begin stuffing the body.

R15 6 dec. (6)



- If necessary, add more stuffing. Fasten off with a sl st and ch. Leave a long tail to close each of the 6 sts with the yarn needle. Weave in the remaining tail.





- Decorate the lower edge of each eye with a strand of white yarn, working from the center outward.
- Finally, for the water spouts, wrap fine **white** yarn around 2 of your fingers and cut 4 or 5 strands. Fold them in half and, using a crochet hook, knot each one at the top center of the head (around the MR) to mimic water spraying from the little whale.
- **Keychain** (Optional): You can add keychain hardware at the top if you would like to use it as a charm.

And that's it! You now have your adorable crochet little whale
